James Acker was a longtime member of West Seneca Seniors / James W. Acker passed away on 14 January 2020 at the age of 84 years old and is interred at St. Matthew's Cemetery, West Seneca, New York

The U.S. Army Ordnance Corps mission was to support the development, production, acquisition, and sustainment of weapon systems, ammunition, missiles, electronics, and ground mobility material during World War II to provide combat power to the U.S. Army

The National Defense Service Medal (NDSM) is a service award of the United States Armed Forces established by President Dwight D. Eisenhower in 1953 / The National Defense Service Medal (NDSM) was first intended to be a "blanket campaign medal" awarded to service members who served honorably during a designated time period of which a "national emergency" had been declared during a time of war or conflict / It may also be issued to active military members for any other period that the Secretary of Defense designates / Currently, the National Defense Service Medal is the oldest service medal (as opposed to decorations for particular achievements such as valor or meritorious service and Good Conduct Medals) currently awarded by all branches of the United States Armed Forces

After his Honorable Discharge from the United States Army, Curtis Ahrens went to work at the Ford Stamping Plant in Woodlawn, retiring after 34 years of service / Curtis J. Ahrens, Sr. passed away on 15 February 2023 at the age of 92 years old

The Korean Service Medal (KSM) is a military award for service in the United States Armed Forces and was established November 8, 1950 by executive order of President Harry Truman / The Korean Service Medal is the primary US military award for service or participation in operations in the Korean area between June 27, 1950 and July 27, 1954 / Bronze service stars were awarded to all services for participation in designated campaigns

The United Nations Service Medal for Korea is an international military decoration established by the United Nations on 15 December 1950 as the United Nations Service Medal / The decoration was the first international award ever created by the United Nations and recognized the multi-national defense forces which participated in the Korean War / The United Nations Service Medal (Korea) is awarded to any military service member, of an Armed Force allied with South Korea, who participated in the defense of South Korea from North Korea between the dates of 27 June 1950 and 27 July 1954

The Republic of Korea Presidential Unit Citation was awarded to units of the United Nations Command for service in Korea during the Korean Conflict from 1950 to 1954 / In recognition of allied military service to South Korea during the Korean War, all United States military departments were authorized the unit award for that period

The Cold War Service Medal Act authorizes a service medal for those in the military between September 1945 and December 1991 who served on active duty for 24 consecutive months during the Cold War; were deployed outside of the continental U.S. for a period of at least 30 days during the Cold War; or were a member of a reserve unit called to active duty to participate in exercises or operations directly related to the Cold War

The United States Army Commemorative Ribbon is intended to recognize those who have carried out honorable service in the U.S. Army / The medal features the Army Coat of Arms surrounded by green enamel and an inscription reading "UNITED STATES ARMY"

Anthony P. Amigone, Sr. honorably served in the United States Army / Anthony Amigone was deployed to Korea and was assigned to the Army Graves Registration Unit which was responsible for the repatriation of the Korean War fallen soldiers / In 1955, Anthony Amigone's role in Japan was to modernize embalming and funeral services in the city of Hong Kong

While in Japan, he was employed by the Mitsubishi Chemical Company serving as a Public Relations Representative and taught colloquial English to their managers / While with Mitsubishi, he had the privilege of being received by the Emperor of Japan / In 1955, Amigone played an important role in bringing American ideas and knowledge of modern-day embalming and funeral service to the city of Hong Kong where he was associated with Paul Chang, the President of the International Funeral Parlors of Hong Kong and Singapore

Anthony Amigone was a graduate of Army Leadership School at Fort Lee, Virginia

Anthony Amigone received his education from the University of Buffalo (Business), the Simmons Institute in Syracuse (Mortuary Science), Kensington High School, Canisius High School, and St. Lawrence Grammar School / In the 1950s, Anthony Amigone designed and built the first modern funeral home in Buffalo, New York / Amigone was the Chairman of the family-owned Amigone Funeral Home, Inc. / Amigone was a licensed Funeral Director in New York State since 1953 and Pennsylvania since 1976 / Anthony Amigone served as President of the New York State Funeral Directors Association / Anthony P. Amigone, Sr. passed away in Florida on 7 September 2024 at the age of 92 years old

The Army Graves Registration Unit is responsible for the identification and burial of all Army, Navy, Marine, and Coast Guard personnel who lost their lives as the result of service outside the continental limits of the United States

The Korean War Service Medal, also known as the Republic of Korea War Service Medal, is a military award of South Korea which was first authorized in December 1950 / The Korean War Service Medal was first authorized to South Korean troops who had participated in the initial counter-assaults against North Korean aggression in June 1950 / On 15 September 1951, President Syngman Rhee referred to and authorized the commander-chief of the United Nations Command to confer the award of the "Korean War Medal" and "Korean War Ribbon" ("Korean War Service Medal"), "to the brave and valiant members of the United Nations Command who have been, and are now, combating the communist aggressor in Korea" / Bronze service stars were awarded to all services for participation in designated campaigns

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The Good Conduct Medal is one of the oldest military awards of the United States Armed Forces / The Navy Good Conduct Medal was established in 1869, the Marine Corps version in 1896, the Coast Guard version in 1923, the Army version in 1941, and the Air Force version in 1963 / The medal is awarded to any active-duty enlisted member of the United States military who completes three consecutive years of "honorable and faithful service" / Such service implies that a standard enlistment was completed without any non-judicial punishment, disciplinary infractions, or court martial offenses

Sergeant Russell J. Anderson honorably served in the United States Army / SGT Russell Anderson was deployed to Korea and assisted in the reorganization of the Republic of Korea (ROK) Army

Base Assignments:

Camp Breckinridge, Kentucky - Built in 1942, the camp was named for John C. Breckinridge, U.S. Vice President, 1856-60; Confederate Secretary of War, 1865 / The camp was created as infantry training center for up to 40,000 men / During World War II, the camp was used as a prisoner of war camp / During the Korean War, Camp Breckinridge was the headquarters of the 506th Regiment of the 101st Airborne Division and was used for the conduct of basic training of newly inducted U.S. Army recruits

Miscellaneous:

Russell Anderson graduated from West Seneca Central High School and graduated from Bryant & Stratton College / Prior to joining the Army in 1953, Anderson worked for the Erie Railroad / After his honorable discharge in 1954, Russell Anderson joined the West Seneca Police Department, retiring after 34 years of service / Russell Anderson was a member of the East Seneca Fire Department / Russell J. Anderson passed away on 14 June 2024

G3 military operations is a concept and application of military science that involves planning the operations for the projected maneuvering forces' provisions, services, training, and administrative functions

The Eighth Army was officially activated at Memphis, Tennessee, on June 10, 1944 and deployed to the Southwest Pacific / The Eighth Army methodically eliminated the last fanatical enemy resistance remaining on New Guinea and New Britain / From 26 December 1944 until 15 August 1945, Eighth Army was actively engaged in the reconquest of the Philippines, the



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largest joint campaign of the War in the Pacific / Eighth Army has transformed multiple times since its establishment / During World War II, it fought in the Pacific Theater of Operations as a field army / In the immediate post-World War II era, Eighth Army served in Japan as an Army of Occupation / At the outbreak of the Korean War, the Eighth Army was sent into Inchon, Korea / The Eighth Army was decisively defeated at the Battle of the Chongchon River and forced to retreat all the way back to South Korea / The defeat of the U.S. Eighth Army resulted in the longest retreat of any U.S. military unit in history / The overstretched Eighth Army suffered heavily with the Chinese offensive, who were able to benefit from shorter lines of communication and with rather casually deployed enemy forces / The Chinese broke through the U.S. defenses despite U.S. air supremacy and the Eighth Army and U.N. forces retreated hastily to avoid encirclement. / A reformed Eighth Army returned to combat effectiveness over several months / Eighth Army slowed and ultimately halted the Chinese advance at the battles of Chipyeong-ni and Wonju / It then counter-attacked the Chinese, re-took Seoul, and drove to the 38th parallel, where the front stabilized / During the aftermath of the Korean War, the Eighth Army remained in South Korea / During the Korea War, the Eighth Army served as both a field army and theater army and throughout the preponderance of the Cold War, it remained primarily a theater army / On November 20, 1954, it was merged with US Army Forces Far East (AFFE) as the major Army command in the region / The Eighth Army is a U.S. field army which commands all United States Army forces in South Korea. It is headquartered at the Camp Humphreys in the Anjeong-ri of Pyeongtaek, South Korea

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The Army Commendation Medal, created in 1945, is a mid-level United States military decoration presented for sustained acts of heroism or meritorious service / A "V" device distinguishes an award for heroism or valor in combat instead of for meritorious service or achievement

William Baetzhold graduated from Burgard Vocational High School in 1952 and enlisted in the Army / Baetzhold was a mechanic for many years with Cope/Bestway Express and then Room For Rent Equipment Leasing, Inc. / William R. Baetzhold passed away on 17 April 2022 at the age of 88 years old and is interred at Arlington National Cemetery, Arlington, Virginia

The 511th Parachute Infantry Regiment was a parachute infantry unit of the United States Army first activated during World War II / It formed the parachute infantry element of the 11th Airborne Division / The regiment participated in the fight for Leyte and subsequently performed a combat jump on Tagaytay Ridge, Luzon / B Co, 511th PIR jumped again to liberate the Los Banos prison on 23 February 1945 / The 511th fought during the Battle of Manila and executed another combat jump at Aparri in Northern Luzon / Following the surrender of Japan, the regiment earned the distinction as the first Allied unit to land on Japan, by securing Atusgi Air Base for General MacArthur's arrival / It remained in Japan on occupation duty until February of 1949 / Men from the 511th were used to bring the 187th ARCT to full strength for its fight in Korea / In 1956 the entire Division was sent to Germany to replace the 5th ID / It remained there until the Division was deactivated in 1958

William R. Baetzhold was a mechanic for many years at Cope-Bestway Express and Room for Rent Equipment Leasing, Inc. / William R. Baetzhold passed away on 17 April 2022 at the age of 88 years old / William R. Baetzhold was laid to rest in Arlington National Cemetery

Florian Banasiak joined the US Navy at the age of 17 years old / Banasiak was a lifelong member of American Legion Post 735 and Pvt Leonard Post Jr. VFW Post #6251 / Florian Edward "Ed" Banasiak passed away on 20 June 2023 at the age of 88 years old

USS Harry F. Bauer (DD-738/DM-26/MMD-26) was a Robert H. Smith-class destroyer minelayer in the United States Navy / She was named for Lieutenant Commander Harry F. Bauer (1904–1942) who was killed aboard the USS Gregory during the Battle of Guadalcanal on 5 September 1942 / Harry Frederick Bauer was posthumously received the Silver Star, the Purple Heart, and promotion to Commander / Bauer was commissioned on 22 September 1944 and participated in the Iwo Jima and Okinawa campaigns during World War II / The Bauer was decommissioned 12 March 1956 at Charleston, entering the Atlantic Reserve Fleet, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania / Harry F. Bauer was struck from the Naval Vessel Register on 15 August 1971 and sold for scrap on 1 June 1974 / Harry F. Bauer received a Presidential Unit Citation for the Okinawan campaign and four battle stars for World War II service

James N. Barren honorably served in the United States Navy / James Barren served twice in the Navy, the first being at the tail end of World War II in 1945-1946, including duty aboard the battleship, USS Wyoming (BB-32) / He was Honorably Discharged with the rating of Seaman 2nd Class and earned the World War II Victory medal

On his second tour with the Navy, Gunners Mate Seaman James N. Barren served on the battleship USS Wisconsin (BB-64) during the Korean War

James Barren was Honorably Discharged from the United States Navy on 27 November 1954

James N. Barren passed away on 20 January 2019 and is interred at St. Matthew's Cemetery, West Seneca, New York

The USS Wyoming (BB-32) was the lead ship of her class of dreadnought battleships and was the third ship named Wyoming / The Wyoming was commissioned on 25 September 1912 and served in World War I as part of Battleship Division One, primarily patrolling the North Sea and escorting convoys to Norway / During World War II, the Wyoming was stationed in the Chesapeake Bay area as a gunnery ship training thousands of anti-aircraft gunners / The Wyoming was decommissioned on 1 August 1947 and sold for scrap

The USS Wisconsin (BB-64) was an Iowa-class battleship and the second ship named in honor of the state of Wisconsin / She was commissioned on 16 April 1944 and served in the Pacific Theater of World War II, where she shelled Japanese fortifications and screened aircraft carriers / During the Korean War, the Wisconsin shelled North Korean targets in support of United Nations and South Korean ground operations / The Wisconsin was decommissioned on 30 September 1991 and donated to the City of Norfolk, Virginia for a museum ship

Fort Stewart, Georgia - Fort Stewart is a United States Army post in the U.S. state of Georgia / It is the largest Army installation east of the Mississippi River, covering 280,000 acres / Constructed in 1940 as an Anti-Aircraft Artillery Training Center, it was officially designated as Camp Stewart, in honor of Brigadier General Daniel Stewart, a native of Liberty County, who had fought with Francis Marion during the American Revolution, and who became one of the county's

Fort Indiantown Gap, Pennsylvania - Fort Indiantown Gap, also referred to as "The Gap" is a National Guard Training Center located in Lebanon County, Pennsylvania / The name Indiantown Gap was fashioned from the Native American presence and geography. "Indiantown" is derived from the many Native American villages that existed in the vicinity of the installation, and "Gap" refers to the separation in the Blue Mountains through which the creek known as Indiantown Run flows / The current post was originally developed by Pennsylvania, on the recommendation of General Edward Martin, as a National Guard training site in 1931 / Over the years, the installation has served as home to the Pennsylvania National Guard as well as active units of the United States Army / In 1941, the post was officially named Indiantown Gap Military Reservation (IGMR) / From 1951 to 1953, during the Korean War, the Gap again had a strategic role as the home of the 5th Infantry Division, whose mission was to train 32,000 troops as replacements for assignment to Korea / During the late 1960s and early 1970s, during the Vietnam War, Fort Indiantown Gap served as one of the largest Reserve Officers' Training Corps (ROTC) summer camps for the U.S. Army / In 1975, after the US left Vietnam, the Gap served as a refugee camp for southeast Asian refugees / For eight months, more than 32,000 Vietnamese and Cambodian refugees were resettled through the installation / In 1976, a section of Fort Indiantown Gap was selected as the new national cemetery for the states of Delaware, Maryland, New Jersey, Virginia, and West Virginia / The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania donated the land for the site to the Veterans Administration / In 1980, the Gap again became a refugee camp when over 19,000 Cuban aliens were brought there for processing and sponsorship after the Mariel boatlift / In 1990, the Gap served as a mobilization and embarkation center for active, reserve, and guard units deploying to the first Persian Gulf War / In July 1995, the Base Realignment and Closure Commission (BRAC) recommended closing Fort Indiantown Gap, except for minimum essential ranges, facilities, and training areas used by reserve components / Today, Fort Indiantown Gap is one of the busiest National Guard training centers in the country, with more than 100,000 personnel training there annually, including reserve-component and active-duty service members and law-enforcement officers

The National Defense Service Medal (NDSM) is a service award of the United States Armed Forces established by President Dwight D. Eisenhower in 1953 / The National Defense Service Medal (NDSM) was first intended to be a "blanket campaign medal" awarded to service members who served honorably during a designated time period of which a "national emergency" had been declared during a time of war or conflict / It may also be issued to active military members for any other period that the Secretary of Defense designates / Currently, the National Defense Service Medal is the oldest service medal (as opposed to decorations for particular achievements such as valor or meritorious service and Good Conduct Medals) currently awarded by all branches of the United States Armed Forces

USS Albuquerque (PG-115/PF-7), a Tacoma-class patrol frigate in commission from 1943 to 1945 and from 1950 to 1953, was the first ship of the United States Navy to be named for C, New Mexico / Albuquerque, originally classified as a patrol gunboat, PG-115, but reclassified as a patrol frigate, PF-7, on 15 April 1943, was commissioned on 20 December 1943 / For the rest of 1944 and the first half of 1945, Albuquerque shepherded convoys between various Alaskan ports and conducted patrols around the Aleutian Islands and in the Bering Sea / Selected for transfer to the Soviet Navy in Project Hula, a secret program for the transfer of U.S. Navy ships to the Soviet Navy at Cold Bay, Alaska, in anticipation of the Soviet Union joining the war against Japan, she then proceeded to Cold Bay and began training her new Soviet crew / Following the completion of training for her Soviet crew, Albuquerque was decommissioned on 16 August 1945, at Cold Bay, and transferred to the Soviet Union under Lend-Lease immediately along with her sister ships Tacoma (PF-3), Sausalito (PF-4), Hoquiam (PF-5), Pasco (PF-6), and Everett (PF-8) / Commissioned into the Soviet Navy immediately,

Albuquerque was designated as a storozhevoi korabl ("escort ship") and renamed EK-14 in Soviet service / She soon departed Cold Bay, bound for Petropavlovsk-Kamchatsky in the Soviet Union, where she served as a patrol vessel in the Soviet Far East / In February 1946, the United States began negotiations for the return of ships loaned to the Soviet Union for use during World War II / On 15 November 1949, the Soviet Union returned EK-14 (Albuquerque) to the US Navy at Yokosuka, Japan / Reverting to her former name, Albuquerque lay idle in the Pacific Reserve Fleet at Yokosuka until the outbreak of the Korean War / The Albuquerque spent a period of the Korean War on patrol and escort duties along the eastern coast of Korea / On 28 February 1953, she was decommissioned at Yokosuka, Japan / On 30 November 1953, the United States loaned the ship to Japan, and she was commissioned in the Japan Maritime Self-Defense Force as JDS Tochi (PF-16) / The US Navy struck her from the Navy List on 1 December 1961, but she was returned briefly to US Navy custody on 28 August 1962, before the United States almost simultaneously transferred her back to Japan permanently / Reclassified as an "auxiliary stock craft" (YAC) and renamed YAC-15 on 31 March 1965, she was decommissioned on 31 March 1969, and returned to US custody on 9 July 1971, for disposal / Her final disposition is unknown / The US Navy awarded Albuquerque three battle stars for her Korean War service

USS Toledo (CA-133) was a Baltimore-class heavy cruiser of the United States Navy active during the Korean War / The Toledo was commissioned on 27 October 1946 with shakedown training in the West Indies / In July 1950, the cruiser took up station off the eastern coast of Korea a few miles north of Pohang, near Yongdok / She teamed up with Destroyer Division 91 to form one of the two alternating East Coast Support Elements of Task Group 95.5 / From 27 July to 30 July 1950, Toledo, Mansfield (DD-728), and Collett (DD-730) bombarded North Korean communication arteries which started at Yongdok and ran north between the mountains and the sea to the 38th parallel north / Toledo's next important mission was the landing at Inchon in mid-September 1950 / The heavily armed and fortified island of Wolmi-do – located in the harbor – threatened the success of the operation / Toledo and her previous consorts – augmented by Gurke (DD-783), De Haven (DD-727), and Royal Navy light cruisers, Jamaica (44) and Kenya (14) – entered the harbor to silence the island's guns on 13 September 1950 / The destroyers led the way through the mine-infested channel and moved in close to draw enemy fire while the cruisers stood off waiting for the North Koreans to betray their positions / By early afternoon, the artillery duel had begun / That evening, the cruisers and destroyers retired for the night / They returned the next day to finish the job / After two days of preparatory bombardment, Marines of the 3rd Battalion Landing Team, 5th Marines, stormed Wolmi-do's defenses / Meanwhile, Toledo redirected her fire to support the 1st Marines who were about to land on "Blue Beach" just south of Inchon proper / After reportedly destroying three gun emplacements and a number of machine gun nests, closing two tunnels, hitting trenches and mortar positions, Toledo retired / Toledo's tour of duty along the eastern coast of Korea lasted until late November 1951 / She bombarded Wonsan, Songjin, and Chongjin and rescued several downed pilots — one, from Boxer (CV-21), twice / Late in October 1951, her guns supported the 1st Marine Division in operations near Kansong / While conducting a shore bombardment on 11 November 1951, she again came under fire from an enemy shore battery which scored some close near misses / On 24 November 1951, Toledo completed her deployment to the western Pacific / On 5 January 1960, she entered Long Beach Naval Shipyard to begin inactivation overhaul / Toledo completed preparations and was placed out of commission at Long Beach on 21 May 1960 / She was moved to San Diego soon thereafter and remained there, in reserve, for the next 14 years / On 1 January 1974, her name was struck from the Navy List, and she was sold to the National Metal and Steel Corporation, Terminal Island, California, on 30 October 1974 for \$983,461.29 / The USS Toledo earned five battle stars for service during the Korean War.

Fort Carson, Colorado - Fort Carson is a United States Army post located directly south of Colorado Springs in El Paso, Pueblo, Fremont, and Huerfano counties, Colorado / Camp Carson was established in 1942, following Japan's attack on Pearl Harbor and was named in honor of the legendary Army scout, General Christopher "Kit" Carson, who explored much of the West in the 1800s / The 89th Infantry Division was the first major unit to be activated at Camp Carson / During World War II, over 100,000 soldiers trained at Camp Carson. Along with three other infantry divisions: the 71st Infantry Division, 104th Infantry Division and 10th Mountain Division / More than 125 units were activated at Camp Carson and more than 100 others were transferred to the mountain post from other installations / Camp Carson was designated Fort Carson in 1954 / In the 1960s, mechanized units were assigned to the fort and it was expanded to the 137,000 acres / Throughout its history Fort Carson has been used for large force-on-force maneuver training / Comprehensive maneuver and live fire training also occurs downrange at Fort Carson / Exercises and deployments continually hone the skills of Fort Carson soldiers / In 2003, most Fort Carson units were deployed in support of Operations Enduring Freedom and Iraqi Freedom / Troops from the 984th Military Police CO, 759th Military Police Battalion were also sent in support of the guard mission at Guantanamo Bay Naval Base, Cuba

United States Naval Construction Battalions, better known as the Navy Seabees, form the U.S. Naval Construction Force (NCF) / Naval Construction Battalions were conceived of as replacements for civilian construction companies in combat zones after the attack on Pearl Harbor / At the time civilian contractors had roughly 70,000 men working U.S. Navy contracts overseas / International law made it illegal for civilian workers to resist an attack and by doing so would classify them as guerrillas and could lead to summary execution / With roots dating back to World War II, the Seabees were formally established on 5 March 1942, to meet the Navy's growing need to construct bases, build airfields, conduct underwater construction and build roads, bridges and other support facilities while providing protection for themselves and those around them as part of the war effort / The Seabees were deployed to Vietnam twice in the 1950s to survey

and map the roads / Seabee teams (501 and 502) arrived in January 1963 as the first Seabees of the Vietnam War / The last battalion withdrew late 1971 with the last Seabee teams out a year later / When it was over, 137 Seabee teams were sent to Vietnam and had built 15 CB camps and deployed 22 battalions / In the over seven decades since its founding, Seabees have gone on to serve in most major U.S. conflicts

USS Sutton (DE-771) was a Cannon-class destroyer escort commissioned on 22 December 1944 / The ship was named for Shelton B. Sutton Jr., who was killed in action on 13 November 1942 when his ship, the USS Juneau, was torpedoed and sunk by an Imperial Japanese Navy submarine during the Naval Battle of Guadalcanal / On 9 May 1945, the Sutton and the USS Neal A. Scott were sent to intercept the German submarine U-1228 which wished to surrender / They contacted the submarine the next day, and the two ships began escorting it to Casco Bay / The Sutton was soon detached to accept the surrender of U-234 and Sutton met the latter U-boat two days later, and she escorted it towards the United States / On 15 May, she put a 15-man boarding party on the submarine and embarked 37 prisoners / Sutton's destination was changed to Portsmouth, New Hampshire, where she arrived with U-234 on the 19th / The submarine and the prisoners were delivered to a representative of the 1st Naval District / U-234 had left Germany with a cargo bound for Japan of a disassembled Messerschmitt Me 262 jet plane, two Japanese scientists, and two high ranking German officers, including General der Flieger Ulrich Kessler of the Luftwaffe / While this was enough to create a media sensation, it was decades later before the U.S. government revealed that the submarine also carried a load of uranium oxide produced by the German atomic weapons program bound for a last-ditch Japanese effort / The approximately 550 kg of uranium dioxide was transferred to the Manhattan Project / Sutton steamed on to New York two days later and remained there until early June / The USS Sutton was decommissioned on 19 March 1984 and loaned to the Republic of Korea on 2 February 1956 under the Grant Aid Program and served that government as ROKS Kang Won (F-72) until she was stricken on 28 December 1977 and sent to the Philippines for cannibalization of parts

The last ground action fought by the United States Marine Corps during the Korean War was the Battle of Boulder City on 23-27 July 1953 near the 38th parallel, 30 miles north of Seoul. Approximately 3,000 Chinese Communists launched an attack in the Berlin Complex ("Boulder City") area held by the 7th Marine regiments on Hill 111 and the 1st Marine regiments on Hill 119. With the peace talks in Panmunjom reaching a conclusion, the Chinese had been eager to gain a

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last-minute victory over the UN forces and the battle was the last of the war before the official signing of the Korean Armistice

During the action the Chinese had attempted to make a breakthrough to the Imjin River along the divisional boundary between the US 1st Marine Division and the 1st Commonwealth Division (Australian) in order to turn the Marine division's flank. The Marines had endured the brunt of the attack, repelling the Chinese onslaught with their infantry and artillery but suffering casualties in the process. Only a few hours later the Armistice Agreement was signed, ultimately ending the war

Staff Sergeant Richard B. Drozdowski honorably served in the United States Army / SSG Richard Drozdowski was a veteran of World War II, enlisting in the United States Army in 1940 at the age of 17 years old / Private Drozdowski was deployed to Africa with the 2nd Army Infantry Division, later being promoted to Sergeant / During the North African Invasion, Richard Drozdowski was wounded and taken as a Prisoner of War (POW) at Casserine Pass (a gap in the Grand Dorsal chain of the Atlas Mountains in west central Tunisia), and sent to an Italian POW Camp in Sicily / Sergeant Drozdowski was later transferred to Stalag 2B Hammerstein in West Prussia / Drozdowski was a Prisoner of War for more than two years before he managed to escape / Russian Armed Forces advancing towards Germany from the East, found Sergeant Richard Drozdowski and returned him to the American lines / Sergeant Richard B Drozdowski was awarded the Bronze Star for his heroic actions during battlefield combat and was awarded the Purple Heart for wounds suffered in combat action / The bullet and shrapnel he received from his wounding were never removed

When the Korean War broke out, our nation once again called upon Richard Drozdowski to serve his country, drafting him in 1948 / Promoted to Staff Sergeant, Drozdowski was deployed to Korea / SSG Drozdowski was wounded during combat operations and taken by Communist forces as a Prisoner of War and sent to a POW camp / SSG Drozdowski managed to escape his captors and with the aid of an Australian soldier, found his way back to the American lines and returned to duty / SSG Drozdowski was awarded his second Purple Heart for wounds suffered in combat.

Staff Sergeant Richard Drozdowski continued to serve in the U.S. Army for 20 years.

The 2nd Infantry Division was first constituted on 21 September 1917 in the Regular Army and organized on 26 October 1917 at Bourmont, Haute Marne, France / During World War I and World War II, The 2nd Infantry Division won many hard-fought victories / With the outbreak of hostilities in Korea on 25 June 1950, the 2nd Infantry Division was quickly alerted for movement to the Far East Command and assignment to the Eighth United States Army / The division arrived in Korea on 23 July 1950, becoming the first unit to reach Korea directly from the United States / Relieving the 24th Infantry Division at the Naktong River Line, the North Korean Korean People's Army (KPA) struck in a human wave attack on the night of 31 August 1950 / In the 16-day battle that followed, the division's clerks, bandsmen, technical and supply personnel joined in the fight to defend against the attackers / In August 1951, the division was on the offensive once again, ordered to attack a series of ridges that had been designated threats to the Eighth Army's line / These actions would devolve into the battles of Bloody Ridge and Heartbreak Ridge / The division would not receive relief until October 1951, with its infantry regiments having suffered heavy losses / After the Korean Armistice Agreement was signed on 27 July 1953, the 2nd Infantry Division withdrew to positions south of the Korean Demilitarized Zone / The 2nd Infantry Division was redeployed to the United States in 1954

The Bronze Star Medal (BSM) is a is the fourth-highest individual military award and the ninth-highest by order of precedence in the United States Armed Forces / The Bronze Star is awarded to members of the United States Armed Forces for either heroic achievement, heroic service, meritorious achievement, or meritorious service in a combat zone / When the medal is awarded by the Army and Air Force for acts of valor in combat, the "V" Device is authorized for wear on the medal

The Purple Heart was instituted in 1782 by George Washington and is the first and oldest military American decoration / The Purple Heart is awarded to military service members wounded or killed in action, in the latter case posthumously

The Korean Service Medal (KSM) was a military award for service in the United States Armed Forces and was established November 8, 1950, by executive order of President Harry Truman / The Korean Service Medal is the primary US military award for service or participation in operations in the Korean area during the Korean War between 27 June 1950, and 27 July 1954

The Korean War Service Medal, also known as the Republic of Korea War Service Medal, is a military award of South Korea which was first authorized in December 1950 / The Korean War Service Medal was first authorized to South Korean troops who had participated in the initial counter-assaults against North Korean aggression in June 1950 / On 15 September 1951, President Syngman Rhee referred to and authorized the commander-in-chief of the United Nations Command to confer the award of the "Korean War Medal" and "Korean War Ribbon" ("Korean War Service Medal"), "to the brave and valiant members of the United Nations Command who have been, and are now, combating the communist aggressor in Korea"

The United Nations Service Medal for Korea is an international military decoration established by the United Nations on 15 December 1950 as the United Nations Service Medal / The decoration was the first international award ever created by the United Nations and recognized the multi-national defense forces which participated in the Korean War / The United Nations Service Medal (Korea) is awarded to any military service member, of an Armed Force allied with South Korea, who participated in the defense of South Korea from North Korea between the dates of 27 June 1950 and 27 July 1954

The Cold War Service Medal Act authorizes a service medal for those in the military between September 1945 and December 1991 who served on active duty for 24 consecutive months during the Cold War; were deployed outside of the continental U.S. for a period of at least 30 days during the Cold War; or were a member of a reserve unit called to active duty to participate in exercises or operations directly related to the Cold War

The National Defense Service Medal (NDSM) is a service award of the United States Armed Forces established by President Dwight D. Eisenhower in 1953 / The National Defense Service Medal (NDSM) was first intended to be a "blanket campaign medal" awarded to service members who served honorably during a designated time period of which a "national emergency" had been declared during a time of war or conflict / It may also be issued to active military members for any other period that the Secretary of Defense designates / Currently, the National Defense Service Medal is the oldest service medal (as opposed to decorations for particular achievements such as valor or meritorious service and Good Conduct Medals) currently awarded by all branches of the United States Armed Forces

The Good Conduct Medal is one of the oldest military awards of the United States Armed Forces / The Navy Good Conduct Medal was established in 1869, the Marine Corps version in 1896, the Coast Guard version in 1923, the Army version in 1941, and the Air Force version in 1963 / The medal is awarded to any active-duty enlisted member of the United States military who completes three consecutive years of "honorable and faithful service" / Such service implies that a standard enlistment was completed without any non-judicial punishment, disciplinary infractions, or court martial offenses

The 1st Cavalry Division ("First Team") is a combined arms division and is one of the most decorated combat divisions of the United States Army / It is based at Fort Cavazos, Texas and was formed in 1921 / The 1st Cavalry Division has served during World War II, the Korean War, the Vietnam War, the Persian Gulf War, with the Stabilization Force in Bosnia-Herzegovina, in the Iraq War, in the War in Afghanistan as well as Operation Freedom's Sentinel and Operation Inherent Resolve / The unit is unique in that it has served as a horseback cavalry division until 1943, an infantry division, an air assault division and an armored division during its existence / The 1st Cavalry was deployed to Nha Trang, Vietnam in 1965 and 26 March 1971 officially marked the end of duties in Vietnam for the 1st Cavalry Division / The service of the 1st Cavalry Division in the Vietnam War was not without a price / As a grim reminder of their remarkable legacy, the 1st Cavalry Division experienced casualties of 26,592 Wounded and 5,464 Killed In Action / The 1st Air Cavalry refers to the 1st Cavalry Division of the U.S. Army, which was the first Airmobile Division / This division is known for its air assault infantry capabilities and has a rich history, including significant operations during the Iraq War, where Apache Longbows from the division engaged in battles against Iraq's Republican Guard / The division continues to provide scalable combat-ready forces and is capable of conducting operations globally / Recently, the 1st Air Cavalry Brigade conducted a change of command ceremony, highlighting its ongoing operational relevance

The Purple Heart was instituted in 1782 by George Washington and is the first and oldest military American decoration / The Purple Heart is awarded to military service members wounded or killed in action, in the latter case posthumously

The National Defense Service Medal (NDSM) is a service award of the United States Armed Forces established by President Dwight D. The 2nd Chemical Battalion is a United States Army chemical unit stationed at Fort Hood, Texas, United States, and is part of the 48th Chemical Brigade / The battalion can trace its lineage from the 30th Engineer Regiment (Gas and Flame) and has served in World War I, World War II, Korean War, Operation Desert Storm, and Operation Iraqi Freedom / When the Korean War broke out on July 25, 1950, the battalion received movement orders on 7 September 1950 and moved so quickly that 47 days later, on 24 October, they fired their first combat mission / The journey. included travelling 700 miles up the Korean peninsula in four days, from Pusan South Korea to YongByon, North Korea / A week later the battalion was over run at Unsan when the Chinese made their first significant entry into the war / Many guns and vehicles were lost and 19 men were killed, some by capture and execution / On 26 November the Chinese made a major assault against the US 9th Infantry, which the Red Dragons were supporting / The Chinese over ran most of the battalion's gun positions, and men continued to fire missions for the infantry while under small arms fire. Six men were killed; two were awarded posthumous Silver Stars / On 14 February 1951, the Red dragons played a critical role in saving the US 23rd Infantry which



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was surrounded at Chipyeong-ni by 90,000 Chinese troops / When the United Nations advanced again in the spring of 1951 the battalion was moved literally from coast to coast / The Red Dragons were the only chemical mortar battalion to serve in the war, and routinely outperformed heavy mortar units of the infantry / It participated in eight of the ten United Nations campaigns of the war. Sixty-one members of the battalion were killed or missing in action / On 23 January 1953 all personnel and equipment of the 2nd Chemical Mortar Battalion were transferred to the 461st Infantry Battalion (Heavy Mortar) / The Red Dragon personnel, serving as the 461st Infantry Battalion, continued in action until the Armistice, completing their ninth campaign, the tenth and last campaign of the war

Private First-Class Ronald Eugene Halliman honorably served in the United States Army / PFC Ronald Halliman was assigned as a Light Weapons Infantryman and deployed to Korea with the 8th Cavalry Regiment / PFC Halliman was classified as Missing In Action in September 1950 during heavy fighting during the defense of the Pusan & Naktong perimeter

On September 3, 1950, the 8th Cavalry Regiment and the 2nd Engineer Battalion, both elements of the 1st Cavalry Division, were holding a defensive line between Tabu-dong and Taegu at the upper end of the Naktong Perimeter / Company F of the 8th Cavalry, defending Hill 448, was attacked by elements of North Korea's 13th Infantry Division and forced to retreat to Hill 449, defended by Company G of the 8th Cavalry / The 8th Cavalry Regiment found itself cut off from its supply train and withdrew from the area to keep from being surrounded by the enemy / Upon reaching the village of Tabu-dong, members of Companies D and E of the 8th Cavalry became involved in hut-to-hut fighting before they could retreat / Meanwhile, elements of the 2nd Engineer Battalion, which had been ordered to take and hold Hill 755, were also forced to withdraw / United States forces did not re-take this territory until 21 September 1950 / Private First-Class Ronald Eugene Halliman, who joined the U.S. Army from New York, served with G Company, 2nd Battalion, 8th Cavalry Regiment, 1st Cavalry Division / Witnesses reported he was killed in action on 3 September 1950, by enemy hand grenades near the village of Igoktong in the area of Hill 449 / United States troops were forced to withdraw rapidly from the area where PFC Halliman fell, and by the time U.S. forces returned to Hill 449 on September 21, his remains had disappeared



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The Pusan Perimeter was one of the first major engagements of the Korean War with 140,000 United Nations troops pushed to the brink of defeat before making a final stand against 98,000 North Korean troops / During the battle, the First Cavalry Division suffered 770 killed, 2,613 wounded and 62 captured

Private First-Class Ronald Eugene Halliman was declared Killed in Action on 31 December 1953 / PFC Halliman is listed in the Courts of the Missing, National Cemetery of the Pacific in Honolulu, Hawaii and the National Korean War Veterans Memorial, Washington, District of Columbia

Ronald Halliman was a 1950 graduate of South Park High School / Ronald Eugene Halliman was 18 years old at the time of his passing

The 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault) ("Screaming Eagles") is a light infantry division of the United States Army that specializes in air assault operations / It can plan, coordinate, and execute multiple battalion-size air assault operations to seize terrain / These operations can be conducted by mobile teams covering large distances, fighting behind enemy lines, and working in austere environments with limited or degraded infrastructure / Established in 1918, the 101st Division was first constituted as an airborne unit in 1942 / During World War II, it gained renown for its role in Operation Overlord (the D-Day landings and airborne landings on 6 June 1944, in Normandy, France); Operation Market Garden; the liberation of the Netherlands; and its action during the Battle of the Bulge / The 101st Airborne was allotted to the Regular Army in June 1948 and reactivated as a training unit at Camp Breckenridge, Kentucky the following July, only to be inactivated the next year / It was reactivated in 1950 following the outbreak of the Korean War, again to serve as a Training Center at Camp Breckenridge until inactivated in December 1953 / From 1965 to 1967, the 1st Brigade operated independently as sort of a fire brigade and earned the reputation as being called the "Nomads of Vietnam" / They fought in every area of South Vietnam from the Demilitarized Zone up north all the way down the Central Highlands / The rest of the 101st was deployed to Vietnam in November 1967 and the 1st Brigade rejoined its parent division / The 101st was deployed in the northern I Corps region, operating against the People's Army of Vietnam (PAVN) infiltration routes through Laos and the A Shau Valley for most of the war / Notable among these were the Battle of Hamburger Hill in 1969 and Firebase Ripcord in 1970 / The division began withdrawing from South Vietnam on 15 May 1971 with the departure of the 3rd Battalion, 506th Infantry / Most major units of the Division had redeployed by January 1972 / In the seven years that all or part of the division served in Vietnam, it suffered 4,011 killed and 18,259 wounded in action / The division, during this time, participated in 12 separate campaigns and 17 of the division's Medal of Honor recipients are from this period of time – all this giving the 101st Airborne Division a combat record unmatched by any other division

The Republic of Korea Presidential Unit Citation was awarded to units of the United Nations Command for service in Korea during the Korean Conflict from 1950 to 1954 / In recognition of allied military service to South Korea during the Korean War, all United States military departments were authorized the unit award for that period

The Korean War Service Medal, also known as the Republic of Korea War Service Medal, is a military award of South Korea which was first authorized in December 1950 / The Korean War Service Medal was first authorized to South Korean troops who had participated in the initial counter-assaults against North Korean aggression in June 1950 / On 15 September 1951, President Syngman Rhee referred to and authorized the commander-chief of the United Nations Command to confer the award of the "Korean War Medal" and "Korean War Ribbon" ("Korean War Service Medal"), "to the brave and valiant members of the United Nations Command who have been, and are now, combating the communist aggressor in Korea"

The 9225 Mobile Army Surgical Hospital (MASH) was a U.S. Army field hospital units conceptualized in 1946 as replacements for the World War II-era Auxiliary Surgical Group hospital units / MASH Units were in operation from the Korean War to the Gulf War before being phased out in the early 2000s / Each MASH unit had 60 beds, as well as surgical, nursing, and other enlisted and officer staff available at all times / MASH units filled a vital role in military medicine by providing support to army units upwards of 10,000 to 20,000 soldiers / The 8225 MASH unit was responsible for providing medical assistance for both US soldiers and injured Allied Forces, as well as Korean civilians / During the Korean War, a seriously wounded soldier who made it to a MASH unit alive had a greater than 97% chance of survival once he received treatment / MASH units often took 24 hours to setup at new locations once moved with armored units, trucks and airmobile / Airmobile or the early stages of what we now call helicopters was crucial to the war effort as they were fast traveling units that could pickup casualties and deliver them effectively back to MASH units / With mountainous terrain in Korea this was crucial as ground transport could compromise the patients lives and would take longer to arrive to MASH units / In 1997, the last MASH unit in South Korea was deactivated

Light Weapons Infantryman lack heavy weapons and armor or with a reduced vehicle footprint / Light infantry units lack the greater firepower, operational mobility and protection of mechanized or armored units, but possess greater tactical mobility and the ability to execute missions in severely restrictive terrain and in areas where weather makes vehicular mobility difficult / Light infantry forces typically rely on their ability to operate under restrictive conditions, surprise, violence of action, training, stealth, field craft, and fitness levels of the individual soldiers to compensate for their reduced

The 23rd Infantry Division, known as the "Americal Division," was the only U.S. Army division formed outside the United States, activated on 27 May 1942 in New Caledonia / It played a significant role during World War II and was involved in the Vietnam War / The division is recognized for its contributions to infantry tactics and logistics, and it was nicknamed "Ever Ready"

The 2nd Infantry Regiment is an infantry regiment in the United States Army that has served for more than two hundred years / It was constituted on 12 April 1808 as the 6th Infantry and consolidated with 4 other regiments in 1815 to form the present unit / In September 1965 the First and Second battalions deployed to Vietnam, landing on the beach at Vung Tau in October 1965 / From there they proceeded to their assigned areas, Phuoc Vinh for the 1st Battalion and Lai Khe for the 2nd Battalion / The battalions initially fought as light infantry in the areas north and west of Saigon / On 2 January 1967 the 2nd Battalion officially became a mechanized infantry battalion / The 1st Battalion sustained its first major casualties of the war on 21 December 1965 when the enemy ambushed the command group of Company B as the company was moving out of Bien Hoa on routine patrol / On 25 August 1966 during Operation Amarillo a patrol from Company C, 1st Battalion was ambushed after stumbling into a Viet Cong base camp, losing 6 men killed of the 15-man patrol, total US losses in the operation were 41 killed, 45 Viet Cong bodies were found, while later intelligence indicated that Viet Cong losses were 171 men killed / During four and a half years the battalions were involved in major operations such as: Junction City, the largest operation conducted up to that time, Lam Son II, Paul Bunyan, Bu Dop (aka Battle of Hill 172), An Loc, and An Loc II and numerous other operations and small unit actions / Contact with the enemy was almost daily / When the 1st Infantry Division stood down in March and April 1970 the 1st and 2nd Battalion's colors were cased and the soldiers were either reassigned to other units in Vietnam or returned to the United States to be discharged

The Purple Heart was instituted in 1782 by George Washington and is the first and oldest military American decoration / The Purple Heart is awarded to military service members wounded or killed in action, in the latter case posthumously

The Combat Infantryman Badge (CIB) is a United States Army military award / The badge is awarded to infantrymen and Special Forces soldiers in the rank of colonel and below, who fought in active ground combat while assigned as members of either an Infantry, Ranger or Special Forces unit, of brigade size or smaller, any time after 6 December 1941

A Marksmanship Badge is a U.S. military badge or a civilian badge which is awarded to personnel upon successful completion of a weapons qualification course (known as marksmanship qualification badges) or high achievement in an official marksmanship competition (known as marksmanship competition badges) / The U.S. Army and the U.S. Marine Corps are the only military services that award marksmanship qualification badges / The U.S. military marksmanship qualification badges are awarded in three grades (highest to lowest): expert, sharpshooter, and marksman while their marksmanship competition badges are awarded in three to four grades (highest to lowest): distinguished, silver, and bronze for the U.S. Army and distinguished, gold, silver, and bronze for the Marine Corps

Light Weapons Infantryman lack heavy weapons and armor or with a reduced vehicle footprint / Light infantry units lack the greater firepower, operational mobility and protection of mechanized or armored units, but possess greater tactical mobility and the ability to execute missions in severely restrictive terrain and in areas where weather makes vehicular mobility difficult / Light infantry forces typically rely on their ability to operate under restrictive conditions, surprise, violence of action, training, stealth, field craft, and fitness levels of the individual soldiers to compensate for their reduced lethality / Despite the usage of the term "light", forces in a light unit must carry everything they require to fight, survive and win due to lack of vehicles

The 38th Infantry Regiment is an infantry regiment of the United States Army and was established on 28 July 1866 / The 38th Infantry participated in the Korean Spring Offensive, the UN Summer-Fall Offensive, the Second Korean Winter Offensive, the Summer-Fall 1952 Offensive, the Third Korean Offensive and the Korean Summer Offensive of 1953 / Five members of the 38th Infantry Regiment were awarded the Medal of Honor for their actions in the Korean War

The 2nd Infantry Division (2ID) ("Indianhead") is a formation of the United States Army / Since the 1960's, its primary mission has been the pre-emptive defense of South Korea in the event of an invasion from North Korea / Approximately 17,000 soldiers serve in the 2nd Infantry Division, with 10,000 stationed in South Korea, accounting for about 35% of the United States Forces Korea personnel / Known as the 2nd Infantry Division-ROK/U.S. Combined Division (2ID/RUCD), the division is bolstered by rotational Brigade Combat Teams (BCTs) from other U.S. Army divisions / The 2nd Infantry Division is unique as the only U.S. Army division to incorporate South Korean soldiers through the KATUSA (Korean Augmentation to the U.S. Army) program, which began in 1950 with the agreement of South Korean President Syngman Rhee / By the end of the Korean War, around 27,000 KATUSAs had served with U.S. forces / As of May 2006, roughly 1,100 KATUSA soldiers are assigned to 2ID / Between 1950 and 1954, over 4,748 Dutch soldiers also served with the division

The Purple Heart was instituted in 1782 by George Washington and is the first and oldest military American decoration / The Purple Heart is awarded to military service members wounded or killed in action, in the latter case posthumously

The 2nd Infantry Division (2ID, 2nd ID) ("Indianhead") is a formation of the United States Army / Its current primary mission is the pre-emptive defense of South Korea in the event of an invasion from North Korea / There are approximately 17,000 soldiers in the 2nd Infantry Division, with 10,000 of them stationed in South Korea / The 2nd Infantry Division arrived in Korea, via Pusan on 23 July 1950, becoming the first unit to reach Korea directly from the United States / The first big test for the 2nd Infantry came when the North Korean Korean People's Army (KPA) struck in a human wave attack on the night of 31 August 1950 / In the 16-day battle that followed, the division's clerks, bandsmen,

technical and supply personnel joined in the fight to defend against the attackers / The division was the first unit to break out of the Pusan Perimeter starting on 16 September 1950 and Eighth Army then began a general offensive northward against crumbling KPA opposition to establish contact with forces of the 7th Infantry Division driving southward from the Inchon beachhead / The 2nd Infantry Division was within 50 miles of the Manchurian border when the Chinese People's Volunteer Army (PVA) launched their Second Phase Offensive on 25 November 1950 / During the Battle of the Ch'ongch'on River, soldiers of the 2nd Infantry Division were given the mission of protecting the rear and right flank of the Eighth Army as it retired to the south / After this battle, while surrounded and outgunned, the division had to fight its way south through what was to become known as "The Gauntlet" - a PVA roadblock 6 miles long where the 23rd Infantry Regiment fired off its stock of 3,206 artillery shells within 20 minutes, a massive barrage that prevented PVA troops from following the regiment / The 2nd Infantry suffered 4,037 casualties, and lost most of its artillery pieces, 40 percent of its signal equipment, 45 percent of its crew-served weapons and 30 percent of its vehicles were lost during the battle / In August 1951, the division was on the offensive once again, ordered to attack a series of ridges that had been designated threats to the Eighth Army's line / These actions would devolve into the battles of Bloody Ridge and Heartbreak Ridge / The division would not receive relief until October, with its infantry regiments having suffered heavy losses / The 2nd Division was withdrawn after possessing both Bloody and Heartbreak Ridges, and the damage they inflicted upon the PVA/KPA (North Korean Korean People's Army) that held the ridges was estimated at 25,000 casualties / After the Korean Armistice Agreement was signed on 27 July 1953, the 2nd Infantry Division withdrew to positions south of the Korean Demilitarized Zone / After the armistice, the division remained in Korea until 1954, when it was reduced to near zero strength, the colors were transferred to Fort Lewis, Washington, Georgia and, in October 1954, the 44th Infantry Division was reflagged as the Second / The 2nd Infantry Division formally returned to South Korea in July 1965

USS Coral Sea (CV/CVB/CVA-43), a Midway-class aircraft carrier, was the third ship of the United States Navy to be named for the Battle of the Coral Sea / She earned the affectionate nickname "Ageless Warrior" through her long career / Initially classified as an aircraft carrier with hull classification symbol CV-43, she was reclassified as a "Large Aircraft Carrier" with



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hull classification symbol CVB-43 on 15 July 1943 / Coral Sea was one of the last U.S Navy carriers to be completed with a straight flight deck, with an angled flight deck added on during later modernizations / The Coral Sea operated in the Mediterranean for duty with the Sixth Fleet from 9 September 1950 to 1 February 1951 / Coral Sea was decommissioned at the Puget Sound Naval Shipyard on 24 May 1957 to receive a major conversion (SCB 110A) / Following the Gulf of Tonkin incident in August 1963, Coral Sea departed on 7 December 1964 for duty with the Seventh Fleet / On 7 February 1965, her aircraft, along with those from Ranger and Hancock, conducted Operation Flaming Dart against the military barracks and staging areas near Đồng Hới in the southern sector of North Vietnam / The raids were in retaliation for a damaging Viet Cong attack on installations around Pleiku in South Vietnam / On 26 March, the Seventh Fleet units began their participation in Operation Rolling Thunder, a systematic bombing of military targets throughout North Vietnam / Pilots from Coral Sea struck island and coastal radar stations in the vicinity of Vinh / On 3 April Vietnam People's Air Force MiG-17s attacked aircraft from Coral Sea and Hancock in the first United States aerial combat of the Vietnam conflict / On 12 to 14 May 1975, Coral Sea participated with other Navy, Air Force and Marine Corps forces in the Mayaguez incident, the recovery of the U.S. merchant ship SS Mayaguez and her 39 crew, illegally seized on 12 May in international waters by Khmer Rouge gunboats / On 25 March 1983, Coral Sea, having been reassigned to the Atlantic Fleet, left Alameda for her new homeport of Norfolk / The Navy sent the ship on a six-month around-the-world cruise, with ports of call in five countries / After nearly 43 years of service, the Coral Sea was decommissioned on 26 April 1990 and stricken from the Naval Vessel Register two days later / On 7 May 1993, she was sold for scrap, minus her electronics, weapons, and other usable equipment

The M2 4.2-inch mortar was a U.S. rifled 4.2-inch (107 mm) mortar used during the Second World War, the Korean War, and the Vietnam War / It entered service in 1943 and was nicknamed the "Goon Gun" (from its large bullet-shaped shells, monopod, and rifled bore) or the "Four-Deuce" (from its bore size in inches) / In 1951, it began to be phased out in favor of the M30 mortar of the same caliber

1st Battalion, 1st Marines (1/1) is an infantry battalion in the United States Marine Corps based out of Camp Pendleton, California, consisting of anywhere from 800 to 2,000 Marines and Sailors, but the number fluctuates depending on the battalion's mission / Falling under the command of the 1st Marine Regiment and the 1st Marine Division, they are



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commonly referred to as "The First of the First" / The battalion has been organized around fire and maneuver warfare in tropical, woodland, desert, or Arctic environments / 1/1 deployed to Da Nang, Republic of Vietnam in August 1965 and were reassigned to the 3rd Marine Division / They remained in Vietnam until May 1971, serving in or around Da Nang, Dong Ha, Con Thien, Quảng Trị, Hue, Phu Bai and Khe Sanh / 1st Battalion, 1st Marines returned to Camp Pendleton, California, in May 1971

The 1st Marine Division (1st MARDIV) is a Marine division of the United States Marine Corps headquartered at Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton, California / It is the ground combat element of the I Marine Expeditionary Force (I MEF) / It is the oldest and largest active duty division in the United States Marine Corps, representing a combat-ready force of 22,000 personnel / It is one of three active duty divisions in the Marine Corps today and is a multi-role, expeditionary ground combat force. It is nicknamed "The Old Breed" / The division is employed as the ground combat element (GCE) of the I Marine Expeditionary Force or may provide task-organized forces for assault operations and such operations as may be directed / The 1st Marine Division must be able to provide the ground amphibious forcible entry capability to the naval expeditionary force (NEF) and to conduct subsequent land operations in any operational environment / In March 1966, the 1st Marine Division Headquarters was established at Chu Lai, South Vietnam / By June 1966, the entire division was in South Vietnam, its Tactical Area of Responsibility (TAOR) was the southern two provinces of I Corps — Quang Tin and Quang Ngai / In August 1966 the division conducted Operation Colorado / Between March and October 1966 to May 1967, the division conducted 44 named operations and the division received its 7th Presidential Unit Citation for service from 29 March 1966 to 15 September 1967 / By April 1971, the Division was back in the United States / During combat actions in Vietnam, the 1st Marine Division lost 7,012 men killed in action / In 1975, the division supported the resettlement of South Vietnamese refugees by providing food and temporary shelter at Camp Pendleton for Vietnamese refugees as they arrived in the United States

The Korean Service Medal (KSM) was a military award for service in the United States Armed Forces and was established November 8, 1950, by executive order of President Harry Truman / The Korean Service Medal is the primary US military award for service or participation in operations in the Korean area during the Korean War between 27 June 1950, and 27 July 1954

The Korean War Service Medal, also known as the Republic of Korea War Service Medal, is a military award of South Korea which was first authorized in December 1950 / The Korean War Service Medal was first authorized to South Korean troops who had participated in the initial counter-assaults against North Korean aggression in June 1950 / On 15 September 1951, President Syngman Rhee referred to and authorized the commander-chief of the United Nations Command to confer the award of the "Korean War Medal" and "Korean War Ribbon" ("Korean War Service Medal"), "to the brave and valiant members of the United Nations Command who have been, and are now, combating the communist aggressor in Korea" / Bronze service stars were awarded to all services for participation in designated campaigns

The United Nations Service Medal Korea (UNSMK) is an international military decoration established by the United Nations during the Korean War / It was awarded to military service members of allied forces who participated in the defense of South Korea from North Korea between 27 June 1950 and 27 July 1954

The Republic of Korea Presidential Unit Citation is a military unit award of the government of South Korea that may be presented to South Korean military units, and foreign military units for outstanding performance in defense of the Republic of Korea / It is awarded for exceptional meritorious service to South Korea / The citation may be presented to units that participated in the defense of South Korea as part of the U.N. forces during the Korean War

The Combat Action Ribbon (colloquially "CAR"), is a high precedence United States Navy, United States Coast Guard, and United States Marine Corps military decoration awarded to United States sea service members "who have actively participated in ground or surface combat" / Coast Guardsmen, Navy sailors, and Marines active in clandestine, stealth or



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special operations are deemed eligible for consideration of the award / The CAR is awarded to members of the Navy and Marine Corps with a rank no higher than captain and colonel, respectively

Camp Hillenmeyer, Kunsan, Korea - Kunsan Air Base is located on the coast of the Yellow Sea in western South Korea and falls under the command of the United States Air Force / It is one of only two United States Air Force installations in the Asian peninsula, with the other being found in Osan, nearly 6 hours away / The base was established in 1938 by occupying Japanese forces as an operating base / After the Japanese withdrawal, the United States took over the base / It first saw a limited use in 1945, and by 1949 only a small handful of US troops remained in the area / The close of 1949 saw the complete withdrawal of US troops from the Korean Peninsula, leaving the base completely vacant / The Korean War brought Kunsan Air Base back into action / When North Korean forces invaded the south in 1950, Kunsan Air Base was one of the first objectives to fall due its almost complete lack of defense / Within a few months US forces quickly regained the base and began stationing troops and assets at the location / The first resident of Kunsan Air Base, the 27th Fighter Escort Wing, became the main unit in 1951 / The 27th Fighter Escort Wing went on to become one of the most highly decorated Air Force units of the Korean War

USS Wren (DD-568) was a Fletcher-class destroyer of the United States Navy and named after Solomon Wren, a Sergeant in the marine Corps / In February 1804, Wren volunteered for the expedition to destroy the frigate USS Philadelphia, captured by the Tripolitan pirates on October 31, 1803 after grounding on an uncharted reef off Tripoli / Under the command of Lieutenant Stephen Decatur, Jr., Wren and 68 other sailors and marines entered Tripoli harbor on the night of February 16, in the ketch USS Intrepid and succeeded in setting fire to the former American ship during the First Barbary War / The USS Wren was commissioned on 20 May 1944 and saw duty with the Northern Pacific Force in the Aleutian Islands / Her duties there consisted largely of patrol and escort work between the islands of the Aleutian chain but did, participate in four shore bombardment missions against the Japanese Kuril Islands with Task Force 92 (TF 92) between November 1944 and April 1945 / In 1953, the Wren joined Task Force 77 (TF 77) in the Sea of Japan / While fast carriers conducted air operations there and in the Yellow Sea, the Wren provided screen and plane-guard services to them between 10 October and 26 November 1953 / Following that assignment, she joined the Australian carrier HMAS Sydney and provided similar services until mid-December 1953 when she returned to Japan / For the remainder of her

active career, Wren operated out of Norfolk periodically making overseas deployments / Among her 2nd Fleet activities were midshipman summer cruises, some to northern European ports and others to West Indian and American ports / She also served with the 6th Fleet in the Mediterranean Sea on several occasions / Transferred to the Naval Reserve Force, the Wren was later used by a Naval Reserve unit in Houston, Texas and based in Galveston, Texas in the early 1960s / In December 1963, after almost a decade of duty with the Atlantic Fleet, the Wren was decommissioned and placed out of commission, in reserve / She spent the next 11 years in the Reserve Fleet, berthed at the Naval Inactive Ship Facility at Naval Station Philadelphia / In 22 October 1975, she was sold to the North American Smelting Co., Wilmington, Del., for scrapping / The USS Wren earned three battle stars during World War II / The ship is seen in the movie "Operation Petticoat" (Blake Edwards, 1959) / USS Wren is also portrayed as the destroyer that first communicates with "George Ray Tweed" in the 1962 Universal Pictures film "No Man is an Island" / Also seen in TV show 'Magnum, P.I.', [Operation Silent Night] Season 4, episode 10, 1983 (archival film footage only, since Wren had already been scrapped

USS Borie (DD-704), an Allen M. Sumner-class destroyer, was the second ship of the United States Navy to be named for Adolph E. Borie, Secretary of the Navy under President Ulysses S. Grant / The Borie was commissioned on 21 September 1944 and joined the Pacific Fleet, arriving at Pearl Harbor 4 January 1945 / She took part in the Iwo Jima bombardment (24 January) and invasion (19–23 February) / After joining TF 58, she participated in the Tokyo raids (16-17 and 25 February), Okinawa raid (1 March), and the raids in support of the occupation of Okinawa (17 March-14 May) / From 9 July-9 August, she served with TF 38 in its raids on the Japanese home islands / On 9 August, 4 kamikazes attempted to crash into Borie's, 1 achieving a hit on superstructure between the mast and the 5-inch gun director, causing extensive damage, killing 48 men, and wounding 66 / the 3 other were shot down or missed / After extensive repairs, the Borie remained in the Atlantic Fleet, except for one cruise to Korea (6 September 1950 – 9 June 1951), during which she served with TF 77 and took part in the Hungnam Evacuation / During a deployment (28 July-4 December 1956), she assisted in the evacuation of American nationals and United Nations truce teams from Haifa, Israel and Gaza, Egypt / She returned to more routine operations, with a few notable exceptions, her 1959 recovery of the Project Mercury nose cone and Sam, the space monkey and her 1960 surveillance duties with the Polaris missile submarines George Washington Carver and Robert E. Lee / In February 1968, Borie began her Vietnam deployment, serving in the Gulf of Tonkin as plane guard and completing radar picket duty / On the gun line, her gunners fired over 7,000 rounds at enemy positions at Phan Thiet and in the Mekong Delta / Returning to peacetime operations in 1969, Borie became a naval reserve training ship until June 1972, when she was decommissioned on 1 July 1972 / She was sold to the Argentine Navy and renamed Hipólito Bouchard (D-26) / She served in the Argentine navy until broken up for scrap in 1984 / The USS Borie received three battle stars for her World War II services and four battle stars for her participation in the Korean War

USS Goodrich (DD/DDR-831) was a Gearing-class destroyer of the United States Navy, named for Rear Admiral Caspar F. Goodrich (1847–1925), and his son, Lieutenant Caspar Goodrich (died 1907) and commissioned on 24 April 1945 / After shakedown training in the Caribbean, Goodrich transited the Panama Canal on 12 November 1945 to support the occupation of Japan / She patrolled between principal Japanese ports until October 1946; then she based at Tsingtao, China, for patrol along the coast of Korea / Goodrich was reclassified a radar picket destroyer, DDR-831, on 18 March 1949 / When the Middle East crisis erupted in 1956, the Goodrich was sent to the Mediterranean Sea in November 1956 to protect Americans in that area / The destroyer supported the landing of Marines at Beirut, Lebanon, on 14 July 1958 / The Goodrich was on Project Mercury recovery station on 12 February 1962 as Lieutenant Colonel John H. Glenn, USMC, made his successful orbital space flight / Goodrich went on alert again with the 6th Fleet during 24 October to 20 November 1962 when the Navy responded to President John F. Kennedy's call for a quarantine of Cuba that choked off the flow of military supplies and enforced the American demands for the withdrawal of the Soviet missile experts and equipment / Goodrich was reclassified DD-831 on 1 January 1969, and was decommissioned on 30 November 1969 / Berthed at Orange, Texas, Goodrich was struck from the Naval Vessel Register on 1 February 1974 / The USS Goodrich was sold on 12 September 1977, and broken up for scrap

The 519th Military Police Battalion began its service as the 15th Military Police Battalion on 18 October 1927 / In over 80 years of service, the 519th Military Police Battalion participated in 14 campaigns around the globe, providing invaluable combat support through World War II, the Korean War, and in expeditions in Panama and the Middle East / The 519th Battalion earned a Valorous Unit Award, five Meritorious Unit Commendations, three Army Superior Awards, and a Republic of Korea Presidential Unit Award

The Purple Heart was instituted in 1782 by George Washington and is the first and oldest military American decoration / The Purple Heart is awarded to military service members wounded or killed in action, in the latter case posthumously

The Korean Service Medal (KSM) was a military award for service in the United States Armed Forces and was established November 8, 1950, by executive order of President Harry Truman / The Korean Service Medal is the primary US military award for service or participation in operations in the Korean area during the Korean War between 27 June 1950, and 27 July 1954

The Korean War Service Medal, also known as the Republic of Korea War Service Medal, is a military award of South Korea which was first authorized in December 1950 / The Korean War Service Medal was first authorized to South Korean troops who had participated in the initial counter-assaults against North Korean aggression in June 1950 / On 15 September 1951, President Syngman Rhee referred to and authorized the commander-chief of the United Nations Command to confer the award of the "Korean War Medal" and "Korean War Ribbon" ("Korean War Service Medal"), "to the brave and valiant members of the United Nations Command who have been, and are now, combating the communist aggressor in Korea" / Bronze service stars were awarded to all services for participation in designated campaigns

The United Nations Service Medal Korea (UNSMK) is an international military decoration established by the United Nations during the Korean War / It was awarded to military service members of allied forces who participated in the defense of South Korea from North Korea between June 27, 1950 and July 27, 1954

The Republic of Korea Presidential Unit Citation is a military unit award of the government of South Korea that may be presented to South Korean military units, and foreign military units for outstanding performance in defense of the Republic of Korea / It is awarded for exceptional meritorious service to South Korea / The citation may be presented to units that participated in the defense of South Korea as part of the U.N. forces during the Korean War

The Presidential Unit Citation, originally called the Distinguished Unit Citation, is awarded to units of the United States Armed Forces for extraordinary heroism in action against an armed enemy on or after 7 December 1941

The National Defense Service Medal (NDSM) is a service award of the United States Armed Forces established by President Dwight D. Eisenhower in 1953 / The National Defense Service Medal (NDSM) was first intended to be a "blanket campaign medal" awarded to service members who served honorably during a designated time period of which a "national emergency" had been declared during a time of war or conflict / It may also be issued to active military members for any other period that the Secretary of Defense designates / Currently, the National Defense Service Medal is the oldest service medal (as opposed to decorations for particular achievements such as valor or meritorious service and Good Conduct Medals) currently awarded by all branches of the United States Armed Forces

The Good Conduct Medal is one of the oldest military awards of the United States Armed Forces / The Navy Good



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Conduct Medal was established in 1869, the Marine Corps version in 1896, the Coast Guard version in 1923, the Army version in 1941, and the Air Force version in 1963 / The medal is awarded to any active-duty enlisted member of the United States military who completes three consecutive years of "honorable and faithful service" / Such service implies that a standard enlistment was completed without any non-judicial punishment, disciplinary infractions, or court martial offenses

In United States Army units, a Headquarters and Headquarters Company (HHC) is a company-sized military unit, found at the battalion level and higher / Considered one unit, a Headquarters and Headquarters Company is essentially two elements within one company / In identifying a specific headquarters unit, it is usually referred to by its abbreviation as an HHC / While a regular line company is formed of three or four platoons, an HHC is made up of the headquarters staff and



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headquarters support personnel of a battalion, brigade, division, or higher level unit / The Headquarters and Headquarters Company provides command, staff, administrative, supply and maintenance, communication, engineer, and medical support for the battle group

The Eighth Army is a U.S. field army which commands all United States Army forces in South Korea / It is headquartered at the Camp Humphreys in the Anjeong-ri of Pyeongtaek, South Korea / Eighth Army relocated its headquarters from Yongsan to Camp Humphreys in the summer of 2017 / It is the only field army in the U.S. Army / It is responsible to United States Forces Korea and United States Army, Pacific / The unit first activated on 10 June 1944 in the United States / The Eighth Army took part in many of the amphibious landings in the Southwest Pacific Theater of World War II, eventually participating in no less than sixty of them / The first mission of the Eighth Army, in September 1944, was to take over from the U.S. Sixth Army in New Guinea, New Britain, the Admiralty Islands and on Morotai, in order to free up the Sixth Army to engage in the Philippines Campaign (1944–45) / During the Korean War, the Eighth Army was deployed to the war zone in July 1950 / The Eighth Army was decisively defeated at the Battle of the Chongchon River and forced to retreat all the way back to South Korea / The defeat of the U.S. Eighth Army resulted in the longest retreat of any U.S. military unit in history / The Eighth Army slowed and ultimately halted the Chinese advance at the battles of Chipyong-ni and Wonju / It then counter-attacked the Chinese, re-took Seoul, and drove to the 38th parallel, where the front stabilized / During the aftermath of the Korean War, the Eighth Army remained in South Korea

The Korean Service Medal (KSM) is a military award for service in the United States Armed Forces and was established November 8, 1950 by executive order of President Harry Truman / The Korean Service Medal is the primary US military award for service or participation in operations in the Korean area between June 27, 1950 and July 27, 1954 / Bronze service stars were awarded to all services for participation in designated campaigns

The United Nations Service Medal for Korea is an international military decoration established by the United Nations on 15 December 1950 as the United Nations Service Medal / The decoration was the first international award ever created by the United Nations and recognized the multi-national defense forces which participated in the Korean War / The United Nations Service Medal (Korea) is awarded to any military service member, of an Armed Force allied with South Korea, who participated in the defense of South Korea from North Korea between the dates of 27 June 1950 and 27 July 1954

The Korean War Service Medal, also known as the Republic of Korea War Service Medal, is a military award of South Korea which was first authorized in December 1950 / The Korean War Service Medal was first authorized to South Korean troops who had participated in the initial counter-assaults against North Korean aggression in June 1950 / On 15 September 1951, President Syngman Rhee referred to and authorized the commander-chief of the United Nations Command to confer the award of the "Korean War Medal" and "Korean War Ribbon" ("Korean War Service Medal"), "to the brave and valiant members of the United Nations Command who have been, and are now, combating the communist aggressor in Korea"

Fort Hood is a United States Army post located near Killeen, Texas and was named after Confederate General John Bell Hood / The post is the headquarters of III Corps and First Army Division West and is home to the 1st Cavalry Division and 3rd Cavalry Regiment / During the late 1960s, Fort Hood trained and deployed a number of units and individuals for duty in Vietnam / As the United States ended its role in the conflict, thousands of returning soldiers completed their active duty with one of the divisions / In 1971, the colors of the 1st Cavalry Division came to Fort Hood from Vietnam / On May 24, 2022, the Commission on the Naming of Items of the Department of Defense that Commemorate the Confederate States of America or Any Person Who Served Voluntarily with the Confederate States of America recommended the fort be renamed to Fort Cavazos, named after Gen. Richard E. Cavazos, a native Texan and the US Army's first Hispanic four-star general

Camp Stoneman, Pittsburg, California – Camp Stoneman was a United States Army facility located in Pittsburg, California / The camp was named after George Stoneman, a cavalry commander during the American Civil War and Governor of California / The Camp served as a major troop staging area for and under the command of the San Francisco Port of Embarkation (SFPOE) / The camp operated during World War II and the Korean War / The camp opened 28 May 1942 as a staging point for units deploying to the Pacific Ocean theater of World War II / In addition to being a staging area for troops in transit, the Pacific Coast Transportation Corps Officer Training School was located at the camp / The camp also housed prisoners of war with the Italian Service Unit of the 18th Italian Quartermaster Service Company, which was based at the camp / Camp Stoneman was decommissioned as a military post in 1954

Franklin Reed was a graduate of St. Brigid's Parochial School and a South Park High School Junior when he quit his studies to seek employment / Reed was a South Buffalo Railway Fireman, a Pressman's Apprentice for the Buffalo Courier Express newspaper and the Buffalo News / Franklin J. Reed was 22 years old at the time of his passing and is interred at Holly Cross Cemetery, Lackawanna, New York

Light Weapons Infantryman lack heavy weapons and armor or with a reduced vehicle footprint / Light infantry units lack the greater firepower, operational mobility and protection of mechanized or armored units, but possess greater tactical mobility and the ability to execute missions in severely restrictive terrain and in areas where weather makes vehicular mobility difficult / Light infantry forces typically rely on their ability to operate under restrictive conditions, surprise, violence of action, training, stealth, field craft, and fitness levels of the individual soldiers to compensate for their reduced lethality / Despite the usage of the term "light", forces in a light unit must carry everything they require to fight, survive and win due to lack of vehicles

The 5th Cavalry Regiment ("Black Knights") is a historical unit of the United States Army that began its service on 3 August 1861, when an act of Congress enacted "that the two regiments of dragoons, the regiment of mounted riflemen, and the two regiments of cavalry shall hereafter be known and recognized, as the first, second, third, fourth, and fifth regiments of cavalry respectively and continues in modified organizational format in the U.S. Army / On 3 March 1855, the 2nd Cavalry Regiment (later to be known as the 5th Cavalry Regiment) was activated in Louisville, Kentucky with troopers drawn from the states of Alabama, Maryland, Missouri, Indiana, Kentucky, Pennsylvania, Ohio, and Virginia / On 9 April 1865, the 5th Cavalry was selected to serve as the Union Honor Guard for the surrender of the Confederate Army of Northern Virginia at Appomattox Courthouse / During World War II, the 5th Cavalry fought in the battles of Los Negros, Leyte, and Luzon / After the surrender of Japanese forces, the 5th Cavalry was part of the occupation forces / The 5th Cavalry Regiment saw action in Korea during the Korean War and left the country on 7 December 1951 after 549 days of constant combat / During the Vietnam War, the 5th Cavalry Regiment was deployed to Vietnam in September 1965 / In Vietnam, 5th Cavalry units participated in twelve campaigns, including Operation Thayer, Operation Pershing, Operation Tet Offensive, Operation Jeb Stuart III, Operation Toan Thang II and Operation Cheyenne Sabre / Six 5th Cavalry Regiment Troopers received the Medal of Honor in the Vietnam War / The remaining units of the 5th Cavalry regiment left Vietnam in January 1973

Indiantown Gap Military Reservation, Pennsylvania - Authorized in 1929, Indiantown Gap, the installation was used by the National Guard until 1940 when the reservation was leased to the Federal government / Following the attack on Pearl Harbor, the post was used to train soldiers for combat / Over 250,000 soldiers passed through the Indiantown Gap Military Reservation on the way to the European battlefront / At the end of the war, Indiantown Gap converted from a staging center to a Separation Center for GIs from Pennsylvania, Ohio, and Michigan / During the Korean War, the Fifth Infantry was quartered at the Gap and trained replacement troops for assignment to Korea / During the Vietnam War and its aftermath, Indiantown Gap hosted summer camps for the Reserve Officer Training Corps, and twice served as a Refugee Resettlement Camp / In 1975, the year the Reservation officially became Fort Indiantown Gap, its barracks sheltered over 32,000 Vietnamese and Cambodian refugees while they were processed and waiting for sponsorship / In 1980 it housed some 19,000 Cubans until they were placed with sponsors / Ownership of the Indiantown Gap Military Reservation reverted back to the commonwealth of in 1998

Fort Devens, Massachusetts - Camp Devens was established on 5 September 1917 and was named after jurist and Civil War general Charles Devens / At the onset of World War II, Fort Devens was designated a reception center for all men in

New England who would serve one year as draftees / Devens also housed a prisoner of war camp for German and Italian prisoners from 1944 to 1946 / The 7th Infantry Regiment, 3rd Infantry Division was located at Fort Devens from 1946 to 1950 / A battalion from Fort Devens was redesignated as the Third Battalion, Eighth Cavalry Regiment, and sent to Korea to join the 1st Cavalry Division / In the 1950s or 1960s the fort was home to the 56th Air Defense Artillery Brigade, part of 1st Region, Army Air Defense Command / Fort Devens was the home of the 10th Special Forces Group (Mountain), less 1st Battalion based in (West) Germany, from 1968 until the Group's move to Fort Carson, Colorado in 1995 / It was also the home of the 39th Engineer Battalion (CBT) until the 39th was inactivated in 1992 / The U.S. Army post which resided at Fort Devens was officially closed in 1996 after 79 years of service

Fort Carson, Colorado - Fort Carson is a United States Army installation located near the city of Colorado Springs and was established in 1942, following Japan's attack on Pearl Harbor / Camp Carson was named in honor of the legendary Army scout, General Christopher "Kit" Carson, who explored much of the West in the 1800s / During World War II, over 100,000 soldiers trained at Camp Carson / Nurses, cooks, mule packers, tank battalions, a Greek infantry battalion, and an Italian ordnance company trained at Camp Carson during the war years / Camp Carson was also home to nearly 9,000 Axis prisoners of war – mostly Italians and Germans / Camp Carson was designated Fort Carson in 1954 and in the 1960s, mechanized units were assigned to the fort

The Browning Automatic Rifle (BAR) is a family of American automatic rifles and machine guns used by the United States and designed by John Browning in 1917 / The BAR was designed to be carried by infantrymen during an assault advance while supported by the sling over the shoulder, or to be fired from the hip / The BAR was used as a light machine gun, often fired from a bipod (introduced on models after 1938) / Although the weapon did see some action in World War I, the BAR did not become standard issue in the US Army until 1938, when it was issued to squads as a portable light machine gun / The BAR saw extensive service in both World War II and the Korean War and saw limited service in the Vietnam War / The US Army began phasing out the BAR in the late 1950s

The National Defense Service Medal (NDSM) is a service award of the United States Armed Forces established by President Dwight D. Eisenhower in 1953 / The National Defense Service Medal (NDSM) was first intended to be a "blanket campaign medal" awarded to service members who served honorably during a designated time period of which a "national emergency" had been declared during a time of war or conflict / It may also be issued to active military members for any other period that the Secretary of Defense designates / Currently, the National Defense Service Medal is the oldest service medal (as opposed to decorations for particular achievements such as valor or meritorious service and Good Conduct Medals) currently awarded by all branches of the United States Armed Forces

Owens engaged enemy shore batteries and silenced several of them, but sustained six direct hits / When his ship went to battle stations, Daniel Trzepacz, ran across the deck and an enemy shell landed at his feet / He proceeded to pick the shell up and throw it overboard / It exploded as he threw it and he suffered shrapnel injuries which remained in both his wrists until his death / He never sought any medical care outside of the corpsman on the ship or reported being injured when he returned to port as he felt he was just blessed to have survived when so many died

Owens was commissioned on 17 February 1945 / In June 1945, the Owens operated out of Okinawa until departing 20 September for Japan as part of the Wakayama Occupation Group / Arriving on 22 September, she supported occupation landings, patrolled off southern Japanese islands, and served as courier and escort ship / With the outbreak of war in Korea, the Owens arrived in the Western Pacific on 27 February 1950 for blockade and interdiction patrols along the Korean coast / While operating off Songjin 7 May 1950, she engaged enemy shore batteries and silenced several of them, but sustained six direct hits / Departing Korea 22 June, she steamed via the Indian Ocean and Mediterranean to Norfolk arriving on 19 August 1950 / She returned to Korean waters on 10 November 1953, and patrolled coastal waters to prevent violations of the armistice signed on 27 July 1953 / She remained on this important peace-keeping duty in the Far East until she departed Yokosuka, Japan, 11 March 1954 / For almost two years James C. Owens operated out of Norfolk and Guantanamo Bay on ASW and destroyer division maneuvers / While in the Caribbean during September 1955, she provided search and rescue assistance to the citizens of Puerto Rico after a destructive hurricane / The USS James C. Owens was decommissioned on 15 July 1973 and sold to Brazil and renamed Sergipe / She was finally scrapped in 1995 / The James C. Owens received two battle stars for World War II service and two for the Korean War

operated as an effective task force screen and gunfire support ship in the invasion of Luzon, then patrolled the approaches to Lingayen Gulf guarding the newly won beachhead until sailing for Ulithi on 22 January / Lowry then served as a radar picket off Okinawa and during this assignment, the ship engaged in numerous actions with enemy aircraft / The heaviest of these occurred on 28 May 1945, when accompanying the picket destroyer Drexler was hit by two kamikazes and sank with heavy loss of life / The Lowry, after fighting to prevent the loss of her companion, stood by to rescue survivors despite the continued presence of enemy aircraft in the area / From 29 June 1945 she covered minesweeping operations in the South China Sea / On 22 January 1952, Lowry sailed, via the Panama Canal, to join the 7th Fleet, arriving at Yokosuka on 27 February 1952 / With Task Force (TF) 77, Lowry served off the east coast of Korea on shore bombardment, plane guard, and screening duty until early April 1952, then had similar duty off the west coast of Korea with TF 95, the United Nations Blockading and Escort Force, through May / On 8 June 1945, she sailed to rejoin TF 77 for gun strike missions / During the Vietnam War, the USS Lowry was deployed to Vietnam, serving off the coast performing plane guard, naval gunfire support, and other duties for which the versatile destroyer was well suited / The USS Lowry was decommissioned and was struck from the Naval Registry on 31 October 1973 and transferred to the Brazilian Navy on the same day / The Lowry was scrapped October 1996 / The USS Lowry received four battle stars for World War II service and two for Korean service

was awarded the Navy Unit Commendation for their actions in relieving pressure on the Marines Corps that were battling the enemy / The division was relieved of the responsibility for the Seoul area on 30 September 1950 and moved 350 miles overland, arriving in Pusan to begin training for another landing at Riwŏn and advancing to the Korean-Manchurian border / Landing at Riwŏn on the 29th of October, the regiment moved quickly northward with the 1st Battalion on the east coast of the Chosin Reservoir and the 2nd and 3rd in the Fusan Reservoir area / On 29 November 1950, when the full force of the Chinese attack struck the UN forces, the 2nd and 3rd Battalions stood their ground until UN elements further north moved to join the battle / Together all these UN elements made an orderly withdrawal from the Fusan area / The 1st Battalion on the east coast of the Battle of Chosin Reservoir was with elements of the 31st Infantry Regiment and the 1st Marines, who were cut off by Chinese forces / Only after long and bloody fighting did these forces work their way south to Koto-ri, and then to the Hungman perimeter / Elements of the regiment were among the units that participated in the Battle of Triangle Hill from October to November 1952 / With the signing of the Korean Armistice Agreement and the end of the Korean war, the regiment began defensive preparations on the Korean peninsula, in case of a resumption of hostilities / The regiment was later reorganized and activated as the 1st Battalion, 32nd Infantry Regiment

The 7th Cavalry Regiment is a United States Army cavalry regiment formed in 1866 / Its official nickname is "Garryowen", after the Irish air "Garryowen" that was adopted as its march tune / The regiment participated in some of the largest battles of the Indian Wars, including its famous defeat at the Battle of Little Bighorn, where its commander Lieutenant Colonel George A. Custer was killed / The 7th Cavalry became part of the 1st Cavalry Division in the 1920s, it went on to fight in the Pacific Theater of World War II and took part in the Admiralty Islands, Leyte and Luzon campaigns / It later participated several key battles of the Korean War / The unit later participated in the Vietnam War / The 1st and 2nd Battalions of the 7th Cavalry fought in one of the first American engagements of the Vietnam War, the Battle of Ia Drang / Over the course of the war, seven men earned the Medal of Honor while serving with the 7th Cavalry in Vietnam / It distinguished itself in the Gulf War and in the Global War on Terror where its squadrons and battalions now serve as Combined Arms Battalions or as reconnaissance squadrons for Brigade Combat Teams in Iraq and Afghanistan

The Korean War Service Medal, also known as the Republic of Korea War Service Medal, is a military award of South Korea which was first authorized in December 1950 / The Korean War Service Medal was first authorized to South Korean troops who had participated in the initial counter-assaults against North Korean aggression in June 1950 / On 15 September 1951, President Syngman Rhee referred to and authorized the commander-chief of the United Nations Command to confer the award of the "Korean War Medal" and "Korean War Ribbon" ("Korean War Service Medal"), "to the brave and valiant members of the United Nations Command who have been, and are now, combating the communist aggressor in Korea"

USS Arnold J. Isbell (DD-869), a Gearing-class destroyer, was the only ship of the United States Navy to be named for Arnold J. Isbell, an aircraft carrier captain during World War II / The ship was laid down on 14 March 1945 at Staten Island, New York, by Bethlehem Mariners Harbor, launched on 6 August 1945 and commissioned on 5 January 1946 / Constructed too late to see action in World War II, the vessel initially served as a training ship with the United States Atlantic Fleet, before transferring to the Pacific and deploying to Korea during the Korean War and off the Vietnam coast during the Vietnam War / In 1972, the USS Arnold J. Isbell was made part of the reserve training fleet and in 1974, sold to Greece where the ship was renamed "Satchouris" and served with the Hellenic Navy until being sold for scrap in 2002

The 187th Airborne Regimental Combat Team (RCT) has a storied history, originally organized as a glider infantry unit in World War II / It fought in the Korean War as part of an airborne regimental combat team and is notable for being the only airborne regiment in the U.S. Army to have participated in every war since airborne tactics were introduced, including the Vietnam and Persian Gulf Wars / The team has utilized various modes of airborne warfare, including gliders, parachutes, and helicopters / During the Korean War, it was involved in significant operations, including Operation TOMAHAWK, where it was deployed into a blocking position near the Imjin River / In September 1950, the 187th made an airborne assault at Suncheon-Sukchon, thirty miles north of Pyongyang, to cut off an estimated 30,000 retreating North Korean soldiers and rescue U.S. POWs believed to be with those forces / The drop included a number of firsts, including the first combat drop from C-119s and the first successful heavy drop of 105mm howitzers, jeeps and other equipment / Throughout the rest of the Korean War, the 187th saw heavy fighting, particularly at Wonju in February 1951 and in March 1951, the RCT made another airborne assault at Munsan-ni / In 1952, the 187th was withdrawn to Japan as part of the U.S. Far East Command reserve / Troops of the 187th later helped subdue POW camp riots in June 1952 / For its



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service in Korea, the 187th Airborne Regimental Combat Team was awarded four unit citations, and three soldiers were awarded the Medal of Honor / In total, the 187th suffered 2,115 casualties in Korea, including 442 killed in action

The Purple Heart was instituted in 1782 by George Washington and is the first and oldest military American decoration / The Purple Heart is awarded to military service members wounded or killed in action, in the latter case posthumously

USS Curtiss (AV-4) was the first purpose-built seaplane tender constructed for the United States Navy / She was named for Glenn Curtiss, an American naval aviation pioneer that designed the Curtiss NC-4, the first aircraft to fly across the Atlantic Ocean / The Curtiss was commissioned on 15 November 1940 / Curtiss operated out of Norfolk, Virginia, and in the Caribbean for training and in fleet exercises through the spring of 1941 / On 26 May 1941, she got underway for Pearl Harbor, from which she served as local guard ship, as well as tending two patrol bomber squadrons / When the Japanese attacked Pearl Harbor on 7 December, Curtiss was able to get underway and returned fire at the attacking Japanese aircraft / At 08:36, she sighted the periscope of a Japanese Midget Submarine and opened fire / A torpedo from this submarine missed Curtiss, running over and into a dock at Pearl City / Four minutes later, the same submarine surfaced and was further damaged by gunfire before diving again, after which the destroyer Monaghan sank the submarine with a ram and depth charge attack / After repairs the Curtiss returned to the Pacific and participated in the battles of Noumea, the Solomons and Okinawa / On 21 June 1945 while in Okinawa to serve as flagship for Commander, Fleet Air Wing 1, a kamikaze and its bomb ripped two holes in her hull and detonated on the third deck, killing 35 and wounding 21 of her crew / Damage control kept her afloat and four days later she was underway for an overhaul at Mare Island Navy Yard / Shortly after the outbreak of the Korean War, the Curtiss sailed from San Diego, to join the 7th Fleet in July 1950, on patrol in the Korea Strait / Sailing out of Iwakuni and Kure, she tended two Martin PBM Mariner squadrons and a squadron of British Short Sunderlands operating over Korean territory / The USS Curtiss was decommissioned on 24 September 1957 / The Curtiss was struck from the Naval Vessel Register on 1 July 1963, and was sold for scrapping in February 1972

Richard Young served aboard the destroyer USS Buck (DE-761) from 1948-1949, with the mission to assist American forces with the Chinese Revolution / Young was Honorably Discharged from the U.S. Navy

Richard Young was called back to active duty when the Korean War broke out / Young was assigned to the USS Marsh destroyer from 1950-1952 / Richard Young received his second Honorable Discharge from the U.S. Navy

Richard Young graduated from Lancaster High School in 1948 / Before his second tour of Navy duty, Richard Young enrolled at Marietta College in Ohio / Interested in history, Young co-wrote several history books / Young founded and became President of the Young Fire Equipment Corporation, revolutionizing the way firetrucks were built / / Richard Young was elected to the Lancaster Town Board and served from 1957 through 1965 / Young was a lifetime member of the Lancaster Eagle Hose Fire Company, joining in 1961 / Richard Young was also made an honorary member of the Town Line Fire Company / Young was a lifetime member of the Royal Order of Masons and member and president of the Lancaster-Depew Rotary Club / In 1968-69, Richard Young became the President of "FAMA", Fire Apparatus Manufacturers Association / Richard E. "Dick" Young passed away on 17 March 2025 at the age of 94 years old

The third USS Buck (DD-761), an Allen M. Sumner-class destroyer, was the second ship of the United States Navy to be named for James Buck, a Civil War Medal of Honor Recipient / The Buck was commissioned on 28 June 1946 / Buck operated with the Pacific Fleet along the west coast from Acapulco, Mexico, to Ketchikan, Alaska / Late in 1950, as a unit



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of Destroyer Division 71, Buck joined the United Nations Forces in Korea / While there she suffered considerable damage in a collision with the destroyer John W. Thomason / Between January and March 1951 she underwent repairs at Bremerton, Washington, and then returned to Korean waters arriving 30 April 1951 / She operated with United Nations Forces until July 1951 when she returned to the west coast / In January 1952 Buck, with Destroyer Division 71, departed for another tour in the Western Pacific / She operated with the shore bombardment forces and with the fast carrier task force until returning to San Diego 11 July 1952 / Buck remained with the Pacific Fleet for the next two decades, conducting periodic deployments to the Far East / During these cruises, Buck escorted aircraft carriers, conducted anti-submarine warfare exercises and carried out security patrols off China and the Formosa Strait / Following a Fleet Rehabilitation and Modernization (FRAM) II conversion in 1961-62, the destroyer resumed Far East deployments, conducting her first Vietnam cruise in 1965, during which she carried out Market Time maritime interdiction patrols / The USS Buck was decommissioned at San Diego on 16 July 1973 and transferred to the government of Brazil that same day / The destroyer served in the Brazilian Navy as Alagoas (D 36) until retired on 30 June 1995 and broken up for scrap / The USS Buck received six battle stars for her Korean service and six battle stars for Vietnam service

USS Marsh (DE-699) was a Buckley-class destroyer escort of the United States Navy / The ship was named after Benjamin Raymond Marsh Jr., who was born on 11 October 1916 in Lansing, Michigan / He enlisted in the Naval Reserve on 17 August 1940 at Detroit, Michigan / His enlistment terminated 13 February 1941, and he was appointed midshipman in the Reserve the following day, receiving his commission as ensign on 15 May 1941 / Initially assigned to the seaplane tender USS Tangier, he was transferred on 4 November 1941 to USS Arizona / Ensign Marsh was declared dead following the attack on Pearl Harbor on 7 December 1941 / The USS marsh was commissioned on 12 January 1944 and conducted training exercises and escorted convoys along the northeast coast / Entering the Mediterranean through the Strait of Gibraltar on 9 July 1944, Marsh escorted convoys between North Africa, Malta, and southern Italy until mid-August 1944 / On 14 August 1944, she sailed from Naples with the assault forces for "Operation Dragoon", the invasion of Southern France / She remained in the Mediterranean for the next month providing gunfire support and conveying supplies in the area / The USS Marsh was reassigned to the Pacific in December 1944 and for the next five months, she escorted convoys to Guam, Saipan, Ulithi, and Iwo Jima / In May 1945, Marsh joined in the active pacification of bypassed islands in the Marianas / Broadcasting propaganda messages in Japanese and Okinawan, she sailed among the various islands of that group, including Asuncion, Anatahan, Alamagan, Sarigan, Maug, and Agrihan, taking on prisoners as they surrendered / Where the broadcasts were not successful, she escorted landing parties and provided gunfire support for the completion of their missions / The destroyer-escort returned to the United States in early 1946 for shipyard overhaul at San Pedro, Los Angeles / Marsh returned to her home port, Pearl Harbor, on 31 March 1947, and for the next three years, operated in the Hawaiian Islands and off the coast of California, deploying in 1948 for two months duty at Eniwetok / Her next Pacific deployment came after the invasion of South Korea by the Communists in June 1950 / Marsh arrived at Yokosuka, Japan on 7 September 1950, and departed on the 14th for Pusan, where she supplied power to the city for two weeks / On 9 October 1950, she entered Inchon Harbor, and remained as support for that area's defense until the end of the month / She supplied power at Masan, a seaport on Chosen Strait, for a month starting on 9 November 1950, then returned to Pusan where she remained as a ship-to-shore power unit for the remainder of her tour / On 8 February 1951, at Pusan, several of her crew were credited with heroic actions in fighting fires which had broken out in the Army gasoline dump adjacent to the pier where the ship lay / Returning to the West Coast on 26 March, the USS Marsh remained at San Francisco for three months before reporting to the Fleet Sonar School at San Diego / Until April 1952, she conducted training exercises for the school and with other units of the fleet off the southern coast of California / On 15 May 1952, Marsh once again joined the battle line off the Korean coast / She patrolled the west coast, operating primarily in the Sochon-Do area, until the end of May / She then steamed to Okinawa for hunter-killer exercises, returning to Korea on 21 June 1952 / Taking up aircraft carrier screen duties, she operated with Bataan (CVL-29) and HMS Ocean in the Yellow Sea / In July 1952, she again headed south, this time to serve with the Formosa Patrol, then on 22 August 1952, returned to the battle line / She patrolled off the west Korean coast initially, but was moved to the east coast in late September 1952 to blockade / She participated periodically in the shelling of troop and transportation centers in the Songin and Wonsan areas / On 22 October 1952, she sailed again to the Korean coast where she conducted patrols until steaming for



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Yokosuka and the United States on 14 November 1952 / For the next five years, Marsh operated out of San Diego primarily with the Fleet Sonar School for six months, and served in the western Pacific for the remainder of each year / During these WestPac cruises, she conducted oceanographic survey tests concerned with the temperature and content of the waters of the Marianas, and the Marshalls in addition to her regular duties / On 10 September 1957, Marsh entered the San Francisco Naval Shipyard for overhaul, then went in reserve / Before decommissioning, she conducted two cruises, one to Mexico and one to Hawaii / On 16 August 1958, she was decommissioned in San Diego, but remained in service as an anti-submarine training ship of the Selected Reserve Forces / During the summer of 1961, Marsh and her reserve crew were ordered activated for a one-year period / She was recommissioned on 15 December 1961, and on 6 January 1962, she sailed for her new home port, Pearl Harbor / On 10 February 1962, she departed Hawaii for deployment in the western Pacific / Operating out of Subic Bay, Marsh conducted training exercises for and patrolled with units of the South Vietnamese Navy, from 18 March to 21 May 1962 / She returned to Long Beach on 17 July 1962, and on 1 August 1962, she was again placed in service, in reserve / Reassigned as a Naval Reserve training ship at the same time, she continued this duty into 1969 / The USS Marsh was decommissioned on 1 August 1962 and sold for scrap on 20 February 1974 / The USS Marsh was honored with 1 battle star for World War II service and one 4 battle stars for Korea

USS Sandoval (APA-194/LPA-194) was a Haskell-class attack transport in service with the United States Navy from 1944 to 1946, from 1951 to 1955 and from 1961 to 1970 / The Sandoval was originally commissioned on 7 October 1944 / Five years later, after war had again broken out in the Far East, Sandoval was ordered activated to support the United Nations effort in Korea / Recommissioned on 22 September 1951, she joined the Pacific Fleet's Amphibious Force in mid-October; and, after operations off the U.S. West Coast, she sailed west on 3 March 1952 / On 24 March 1952, she arrived in Japan; and, in mid-April, she carried cargo to Inchon, whence she moved troops to Koje Do to assist in stemming the prisoner of war (POW) riots on that island / In May and early June, she conducted amphibious training exercises; and, at mid-month, she headed south to the Philippines and Hong Kong / In July, she returned to Japan, where she resumed cargo and

amphibious training operations / In 1953, she completed inactivation overhaul and was decommissioned at Mare Island, California, on 22 June 1955 / Four and one-half years later, on 10 December 1959, she was transferred to the Maritime Administration's National Defense Reserve Fleet; and, on 1 July 1960, her name was struck from the Navy list/ She was scrapped in 1983

USS Brownson (DD-868) was a Gearing-class destroyer and the second ship of the United States Navy to be named for Rear Admiral Willard H. Brownson, USN (1845–1935) / in February 1951 she joined the 6th Fleet in the Mediterranean / The period between October 1951 and August 1952 was spent in the vicinity of Newport / In August 1952 she went to the North Atlantic with the 2nd Fleet for NATO's Operation Mainbrace / In October 1952 she rejoined the 6th Fleet in the Mediterranean / Returning to Newport in February 1953, she operated along the Atlantic seaboard and in the Caribbean until August 1954, with the exception of one Midshipmen cruise and participation in Operation Springboard / Brownson was decommissioned and stricken from the Naval Vessel Register on 30 September 1976 and sold for scrap on 10 June 1977

USS Kyne (DE-744) was a Cannon-class destroyer escort built for the United States Navy during World War II / She was commissioned on 4 April 1944 and served in the Pacific Ocean and provided escort service against submarine and air attack for Navy vessels and convoys / She returned home after the war with a very commendable accumulation of six battle stars / The Kyne was decommissioned at Green Cove Springs, Florida, on 14 June 1946 and operated as a reserve training ship out of Fort Schuyler, New York / She was recommissioned on 21 November 1950 and was assigned to the 3rd Naval District as a reserve training ship / For the next nine years, Kyne provided the training necessary to maintain a well-drilled reserve, ready to defend the nation during any crisis / The Kyne was decommissioned on 17 June 1960, at New York and she remained in the Atlantic Reserve Fleet at Philadelphia until she was sold for scrapping on 1 November 1973

A Radarman was a rating in the U.S. Navy and the U.S. Coast Guard during, and after, World War II / The radarman was generally required to attend and complete a U.S. Navy Class "A" radar school at a designated Naval Training Centers (NTC) in the United States / Once assigned to a ship or shore station, the radarman was required to operate and maintain the installed radar and electronic warfare equipment / Radarmen were specially trained in emergency repair procedures, as their assigned vessels went into combat areas / Radarman also operates radar, navigation, and communications equipment in shipboard and combat information centers (CICs) or bridges / They detect and track ships, planes, and missiles. They operate and maintain IFF (identification friend or foe) systems

USS Hollis (DE-794/APD-86) was a Buckley-class destroyer escort in service with the United States Navy from 1944 to 1947 and from 1951 to 1956 / The USS Hollis was named after Lt. (j.g.) Ralph Hollis who was killed aboard the USS Arizona during the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor on 7 December 1941 / The Hollis was commissioned on 24 January 1944 at Orange, Texas / Hollis escorted convoys in the Mediterranean, and escorted a convoy to the southern France invasion area on 15 August 1944, as Allied troops stormed ashore / In the months that followed, as the offensive gained momentum, Hollis continued her role as an escort in the Mediterranean, ensuring the flow of vital supplies and men /

Fitted out to carry amphibious assault troops, Hollis was reclassified APD-86, on 24 January 1945 and immediately began training with Underwater Demolition Teams, the Navy's famed "frogmen", on Maui island in the Pacific / Converted to a UDT flagship, Hollis sailed to Eniwetok and Guam as the Japanese were accepting surrender terms, arriving Apra Harbor, Japan on 23 August 1945 / Hollis, now flagship for Pacific UDT forces, sailed to Tokyo Bay to assist in the occupation, arriving on 1 September 1945 / There she witnessed the formal surrender ceremonies of the Japanese Empire the next day / Following occupation duties, the ship sailed for San Diego California, where she arrived on 23 October 1945 before sailing to Green Cove Springs, Florida, on 13 October 1946 / The USS Hollis was decommissioned on 5 May 1947 and entered the Atlantic Reserve Fleet / With the increase in fleet strength brought about by the Korean War, Hollis was recommissioned on 6 April 1951 / For the next five years, the Hollis participated in amphibious exercises, antisubmarine training, and maneuvers / In 1954 and 1955 she served briefly as school ship for Fleet Sonar School, Key West, Florida / In 1954 she took part in a North Atlantic cold weather exercise off Labrador, and in 1955 her schedule included a month of training of Naval Reserve Officer Training Corps midshipman training / Hollis arrived in Green Cove Springs, Florida, on 17 July 1956, and was decommissioned there 16 October 1956 / Stricken from the Navy Register on 15 September 1974, the USS Hollis was sold for scrap on 1 July 1975 / The USS Hollis received one battle star for World War II service

USS Monmouth County (LST-1032) was an LST-542-class tank landing ship built for the United States Navy during World War II / She was named after Monmouth County, New Jersey and was the only U.S. Naval vessel to bear the name / Originally laid down as LST-1032 on 9 June 1944 by the Boston Navy Yard, Boston, Massachusetts; the ship was launched on 9 July 1944 and commissioned on 1 August 1944 / After shakedown, LST-1032 sailed on 23 January 1945 to take part in the assault on Iwo Jima / While debarking Marines there, on 20 February, an enemy shell struck her bow, killing one Marine and wounding nine / Despite this, rough seas, and stiff Japanese opposition, she completed debarking her troops and supplies on the 22nd, and proceeded to Saipan / She next sailed from Saipan to take part in the Okinawa invasion, arriving off that island on 1 April 1945 / Discharging her cargo and men, she departed for Saipan, returning to Okinawa on 30 May 1945 with more supplies / LST-1032 then steamed to the Philippines, arriving San Pedro Bay on 15 June 1945 / Until Japan's surrender, she ferried troops and munitions among the Philippines, with two additional runs to Okinawa / She carried occupation troops to the Japanese home islands until 19 November 1945, when she sailed for the United States, arriving San Francisco on 30 December 1945 / Sailing to the east coast, LST-1032 anchored off Little Creek, Virginia on 15 April 1946 and joined the Amphibious Force, U.S. Atlantic Fleet, with which she operated for the next nine years / She joined expeditions to Greenland in 1951 and 1952, and took part in training exercises in the Caribbean / LST-1032 was re-named the USS Monmouth County on 1 July 1955 / The ship was decommissioned on 14 October 1955, and berthed in the Florida Group, Atlantic Reserve Fleet until August 1961 when she transferred to the Philadelphia Group / The USS Monmouth County was recommissioned on 28 May 1963 as a unit of Reserve LST Squadron 2, based at Little Creek, Virginia / In 1966, Monmouth County sailed for South Vietnam / Assigned to the Service Force, Pacific Fleet, she operated between the Demilitarized Zone and the Mekong Delta, carrying foodstuffs, ammunition, and construction equipment / Following a visit to the Republic of China in February 1967, she returned to Vietnamese waters for three additional tours between 1968 and March 1970 / The Monmouth County was decommissioned at Vallejo, California and struck from the Naval Vessel Register on 12 August 1970 / The Monmouth County was sold for scrapping to Zidell Explorations, Inc. of Portland, Oregon on 11 September 1971 / LST-1032 received either two (Navsource) or four (DANFS) battle stars for World War II service / USS Monmouth County earned 11 Campaign Stars for Vietnam service
